### **Posting of New Vice-Principal**

The school has a new Vice-Principal, Mr Kelvin Ho, who just joined us. Mr Ho, an experienced school leader, has just returned from his Leaders in Education Programme, a milestone leadership programme for school leaders. We look forward to his contribution to the school.

### **Singapore Mathematics Skills Check for Primary 2**

Singapore Examinations and Assessment Board (SEAB) has developed the Singapore Mathematics Skills Check for Primary 2 (MathsCheck-P2), an online assessment tool, designed to measure students' performance in foundational knowledge and skills in Mathematics at the end of Primary 2. The purpose of the tool is to empower teachers to identify students' strength and weaknesses in Mathematics so that they can improve their instruction and hence students' learning.

The Primary 2 students would be scheduled to take the MathsCheck-P2 assessment **between 30 Oct 17 and 1 Nov 17**. The assessment would take about 1 hour and the students would be assessed on the Primary 1 and 2 Mathematics topics. There is **no need** for students to prepare for this assessment and this **would not** be counted towards the weighted assessment in school.

### **Use of Calculators for Primary 5 & 6 Standard & Foundation Mathematics**

The introduction of calculators at Primary 5 and 6 aims to enhance the teaching and learning of Mathematics at the primary level in two ways. Firstly, calculators facilitate the use of more exploratory approaches in learning mathematical concepts, some of which may require repeated computations, or computations with large numbers or decimals. Secondly, the use of calculators enables teachers to use resources from everyday life, such as advertisements, to construct real-life problems with real-life numbers that may be difficult for students to work with without a calculator. Students would hence be better able to see the connection between Mathematics and the world around them.

Calculators would be used during the Primary 5 and 6 examinations and only models that are approved by the Singapore Examinations & Assessment Board (SEAB) will be allowed. The school has adopted the model, **CASIO fx-96SG PLUS**, and this would be included in the 2018 Primary 5 & 6 Book List.

### **Use of Dictionaries for Primary 5 & 6 Standard Mother Tongue**

For P5 & P6 students sitting for MT & HMT Paper 1 (Composition), SEAB-approved Dictionaries or e-Dictionaries which are endorsed by the school can be brought into the examination room. The list of approved dictionaries is also available on the following SEAB website - [http://www.seab.gov.sg/pages/dictionary\\_list.asp](http://www.seab.gov.sg/pages/dictionary_list.asp).

Do note that there should not be any form of annotation, e.g. tagging pages with stickers, highlighted text and written text in the dictionary. In the event that annotation is found, the students will proceed with the composition assessment without the dictionary.

### **MOE Financial Assistance Scheme (FAS) for 2018**

The MOE FAS leaflet, which is written in 4 languages and given via your child, shows the criteria, benefits and application procedure for Singaporean students who are in need of financial assistance. Eligible applicants can apply using the attached application form and submit it together with supporting documents to the General Office by **Fri, 27 Oct 17**.

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### **Traffic Advisory**

We would like to again remind and urge parent drivers to observe traffic regulations in and around the school. Please always allow your child to board/alight safely only at designated pick-up and drop-off points. The school, Land Transport Authority (LTA) and the Traffic Police (TP) have received numerous feedback from nearby residents that our parent drivers are seen dropping and picking up their child unsafely along Sengkang East Way and also Anchorvale Link (before and after the School Main Gate). This practice is dangerous and obstructs the flow of traffic along these two roads.

### **Sheltered Walkway**

The construction of the sheltered walkway linking the Side Gate to the Foyer is completed. The school is now waiting for the various checks to be completed by relevant authorities before the sheltered walkway can be used. The school is expecting the final clearance to be given in Nov 17.

As safety continues to take priority for our children, in the interim, we seek your support to comply with all safety instructions and advisory put up by the school and relevant authorities at various affected areas till the sheltered walkway is officially commissioned.

The school had also earlier advised parents that the Land Transport Authority (LTA) would also be constructing a high covered linkway across the pedestrian crossing in front of the school Main Gate. We have been informed that construction would begin in late Nov 17. We will keep all parents informed of the progress, particularly if there is further traffic advisory for parents to note.

### **Punctuality & Attendance**

***Punctuality is a virtue which we would like to inculcate in our students.*** We have observed quite a number of students are habitually coming in late and rushing up to class for lessons. We would like to appeal to all parents to inculcate in your child from young the good habits of coming in early to settle down before lesson starts. We would also like to remind parents that curriculum time is precious and students should not be taken out of school during school terms without valid reasons. The school does not support cases of parents bringing students for holidays during term time.
