Updates on school matters

As we have come to the end of Term 4, we would like to update parents/guardians of the following:

Trace Together (TT) Token

If your child is returning to school during the school holidays for any activities, please remind your child to bring his or her TT token for check-in via SafeEntry at our Security Guard Post. This would include students returning to our Student Care Centre (SCC). To facilitate contact tracing, we urge parents to constantly remind and encourage your child to form the good habit of having the TT Token with him or her at all times before leaving the house.

If the token is faulty or out of battery, please arrange for your child to get a replacement immediately. If your child has yet to collect his or her TT token, we would strongly encourage you to get one for your child soonest so as to facilitate contact tracing, especially during the coming school holidays.

School Canteen

Please be informed that with effect from 4 Jan 2022, the price of set meals sold in the school canteen will be \$1.50 and \$1.80 per set for the regular and large portion respectively. Please assist to inform your child regarding the pricing for set meals before the school reopens on 4 Jan 2022

Beside the provision of vegetables in each set meal, fruits are also included and we urge parents to help us encourage your child to consume the fruits. This will ensure your child is trained from young to eat a balanced diet.
