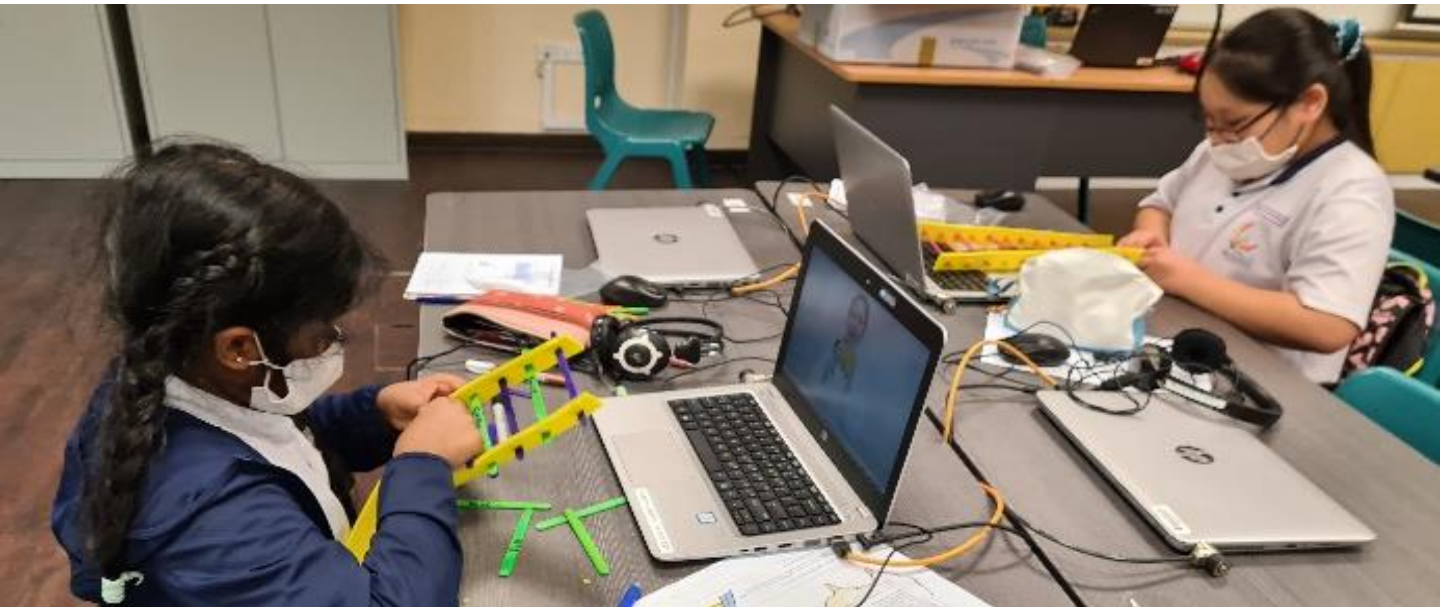


P5 Science Workshop on DNA Basics

The school worked with Science Centre Singapore to organise a Home-Based-Learning (HBL) Workshop covering DNA Basics for all Primary 5 students. The lesson aimed to complement the curriculum unit on Cells and broaden our students' learning experience in Science. Students found the session engaging and that it had piqued their curiosity to learn more about cells.


Throughout the 3 days, students were also given opportunities to demonstrate and live out our school values of respect, resilience, responsibility, integrity, care and harmony.

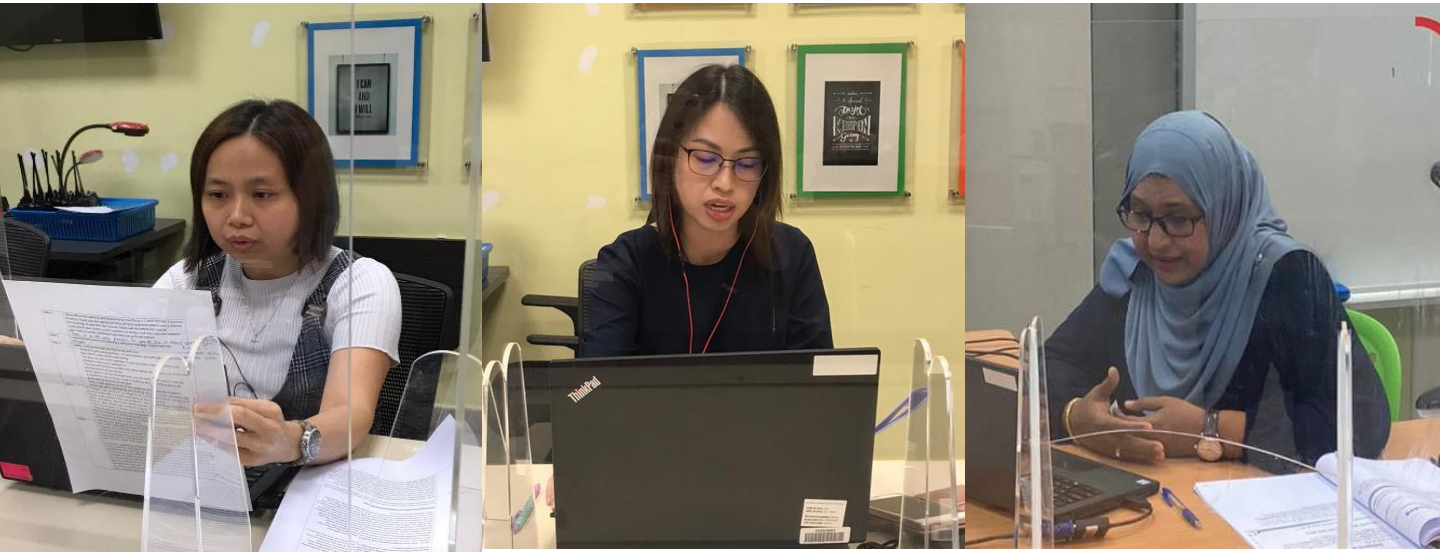
