Racial Harmony Day 2021

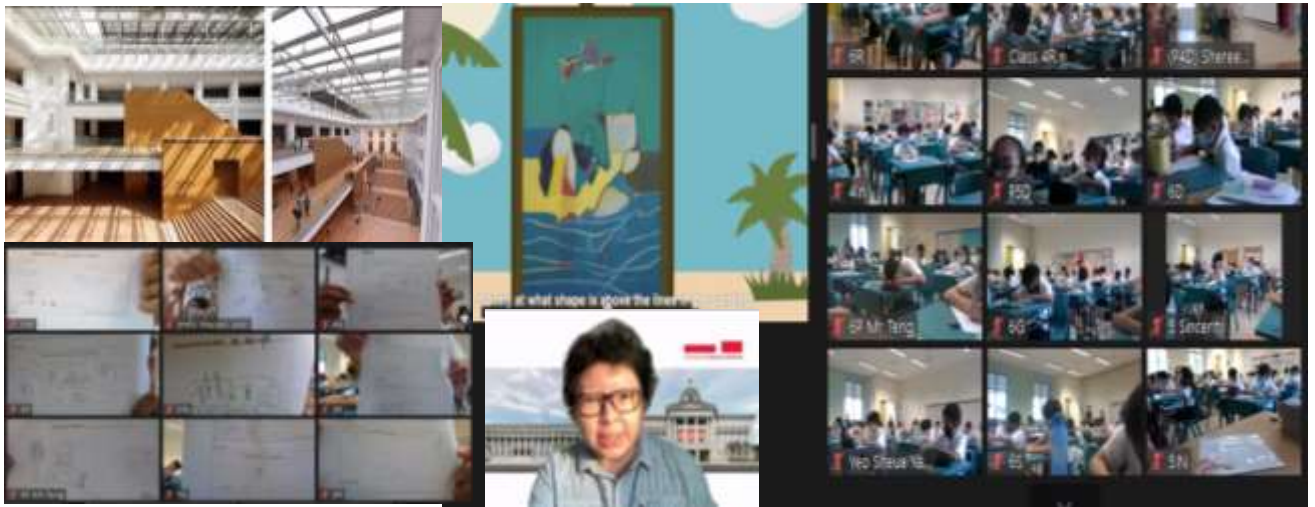


Art Assembly

Lower Primary Games Carnival

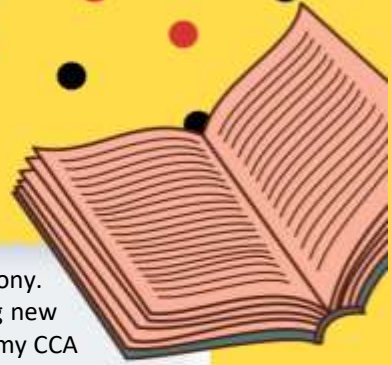

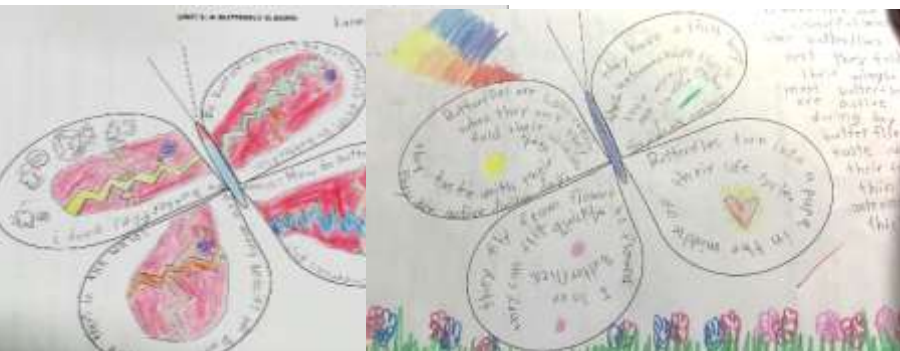
