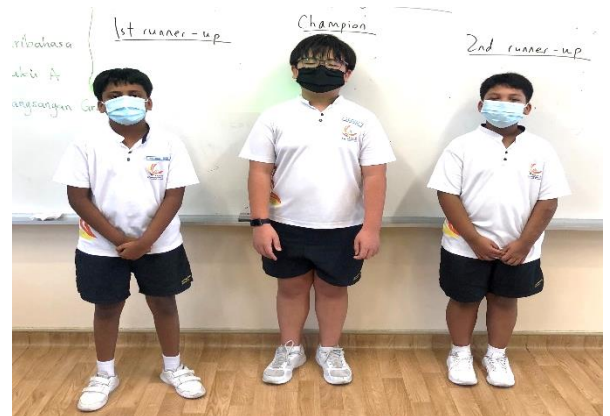

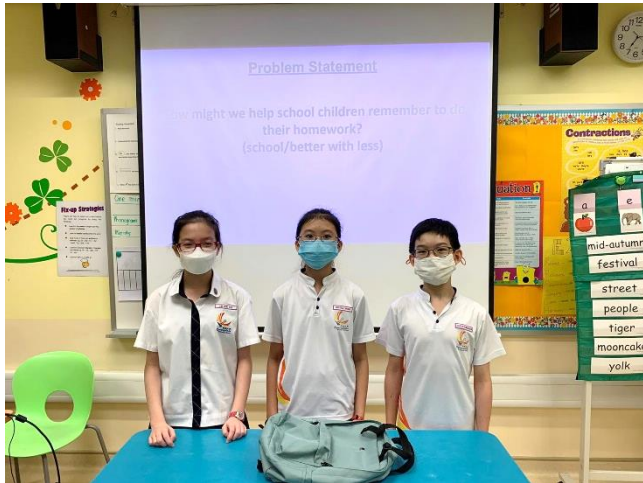

CCA Achievement

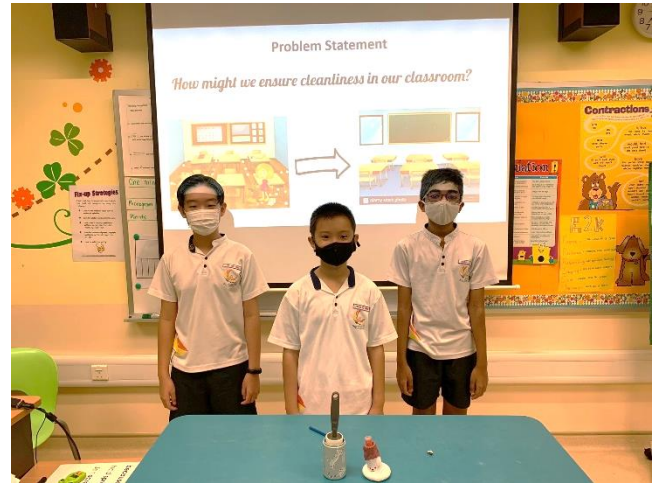

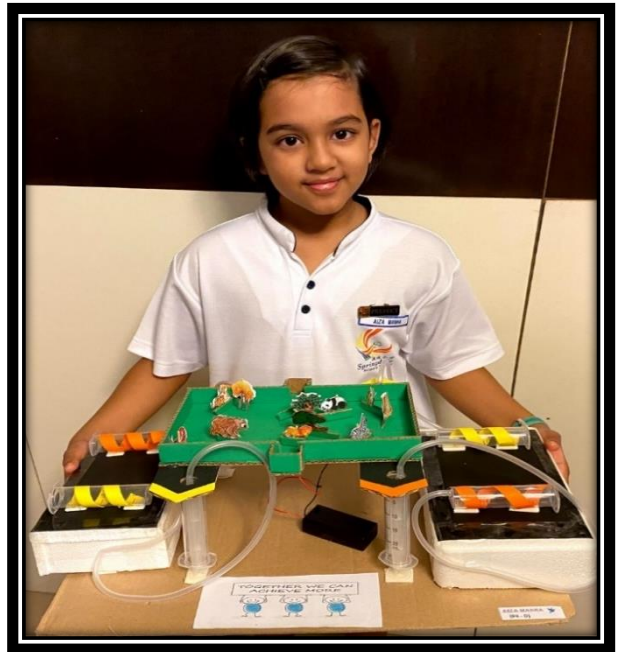

Pre-recorded videos were shared starting with the Children's Day message read by Mdm Neo. This was followed by students' and teachers' performances.



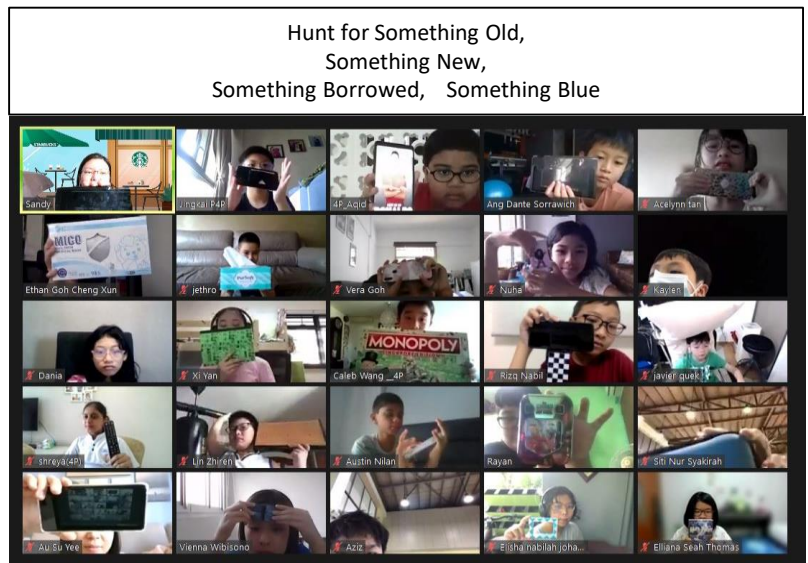
Principal's virtual sharing of the Children's Day Message



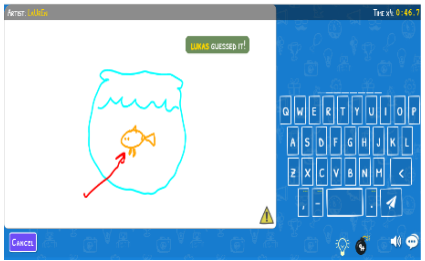

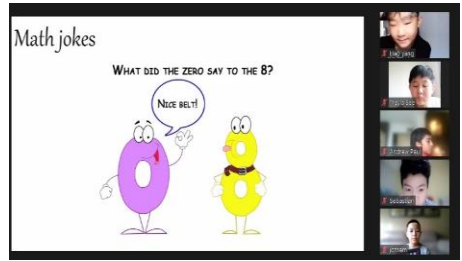
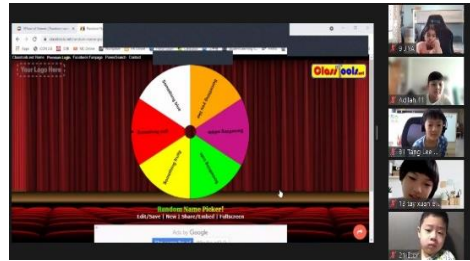
Form teachers also interacted and played some games with their classes during the virtual celebrations. We hope the children had a wonderful virtual celebration together.

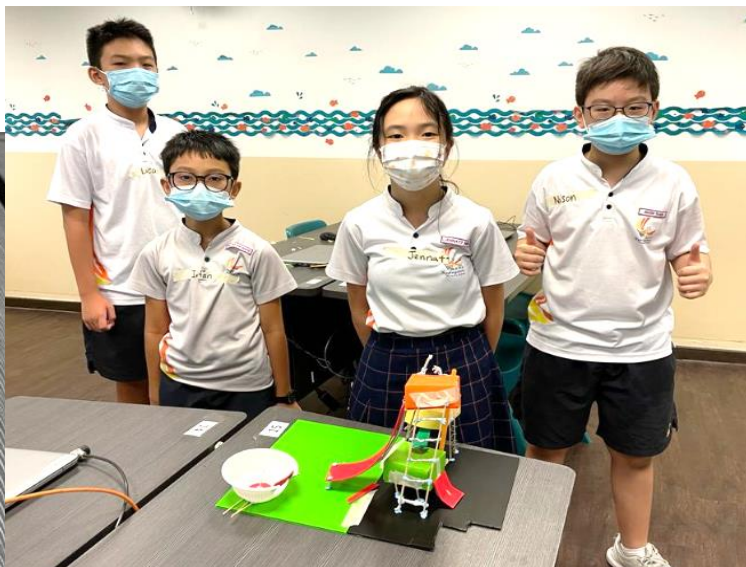
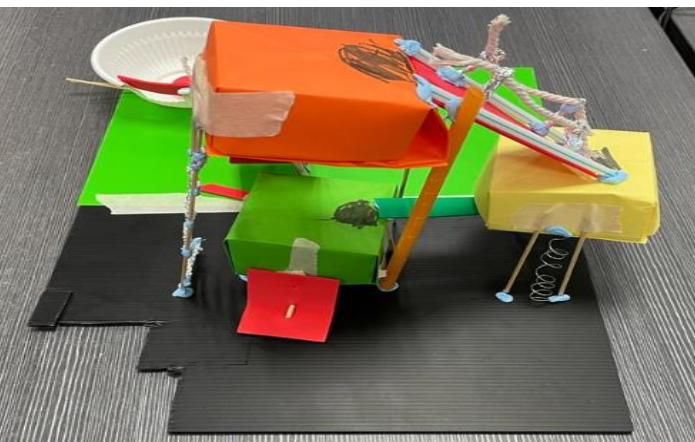
Eastzone STEM Design Challenge
